## **Research Excellence**

#### Water science

Since establishing Australia's first School of Environment 30 years ago, Griffith has maintained an international reputation for excellence in environmental research. The Australian Rivers Institute is home to over 20 scientists and research students, making it the largest concentration of university-based water researchers in the country.

The Institute plays a leading role in managing water resources with a focus on freshwater, estuarine and urban water. On-campus facilities include the state-of-the-art \$18 million Queensland Smart Water Research Facility, which provides Griffith researchers access to specialised laboratories and cutting-edge water research opportunities.

### Drug discovery and infectious diseases

Griffith University is a leader in drug discovery with a strong focus on infectious diseases. The University's top chemists, biologists and health-care scientists are tackling cross-disciplinary solutions to a wide range of diseases.

Griffith's Institute for Glycomics leads international research in the new science of carbohydrates-based drug discovery. The Institute is the only one of its kind in Australia and one of only six in the world. In 2013, researchers at the Institute made a crucial step towards the development of a





malaria vaccine after successfully inducing malaria immunity in animals. First-stage human trials are now underway.

Griffith's Eskitis Institute is home to the Queensland Compound Library – Australia's only integrated compound management and logistics facility – and the Nature bank, a unique collection of over 200,000 samples derived from plants and marine invertebrates. The Bank is shared with researchers around the world who test the library to find compounds that could be developed into new drugs.

### Climate change adaptation

The Griffith Climate Change Response Program (GCCRP) leads Griffith University's research into climate change adaptation and mitigation. The program promotes a multidisciplinary approach to climate change research inclusive of the environmental, social, economic and governance dimensions.

GCCRP helps fund, promote, and coordinate a range of cooperative, multidisciplinary research projects with colleagues nationally and internationally, and operates an ongoing program to support international research visitors.

#### Health and chronic diseases

Griffith's Health Group is one of the fastest growing in the country. The University has established a unique health and knowledge precinct with the co-location of the Gold Coast University Hospital, Griffith Health Centre and Griffith Health Institute at the Gold Coast campus.

The Griffith Health Institute brings together clinical researchers and scientists working on some of the world's most important health research areas such as cancer, heart disease, population trends, psychology and diabetes. The Institute focuses on innovations in the delivery of health care and promotes early intervention and prevention of diseases and disorders within the community.



In a world first, Griffith offered postgraduate programs in suicidology in 2001. Since then, the Australian Institute for Suicide Research and Prevention, located at our Mt Gravatt campus, has been at the forefront of national and international suicide research. In affiliation with the World Health Organisation, the Institute conducts research in all aspects of suicide prevention.

### **Physical sciences**

Griffith's Centre for Quantum Dynamics has world-leading research in ultrafast quantum processes, quantum information, and quantum foundations, with strong collaborations between its theorists and its experimentalists. The Centre hosts the Queensland Nodes of two Australian Research Council Centres of Excellence: the Centre for Quantum Computation and Communication Technology, and the Centre for Coherent X-ray Science. It is also home to the Australian Attosecond Science Facility, the only place in Australia where atoms and molecules can be probed on sub-atomic timescales.

Griffith's Queensland Micro- and Nanotechnology Centre carries out world-leading academic and commercial research on micro-and nanotechnology problems that are integral to the development of clean and intelligent systems. It has particular strengths in sustainable energy technologies, novel devices and materials, theory and modelling.

#### **Environmental sciences**

Environmental Science at Griffith is largely addressed through the activities of the Environmental Futures Research Institute. The institute has become a major centre of research excellence in environmental sciences with 40 active researchers, 16 international visitors, 42 adjunct staff, 26 technical and administrative staff and more than 79 Higher Degree Research (HDR) students.

The Environmental Futures Research Institute is trans-disciplinary, solutions oriented, locally active yet globally engaged, and diverse in research expertise - combining fundamental, applied and social sciences. The Institute's multidisciplinary nature emerges from synergies of the Griffith School of Environment and School of Biomolecular and Physical Sciences academics and students.



## **Nursing**

Nursing research at Griffith University is conducted through the Centre for Health Practice Innovation, established in 2003. The Centre for Health Practice Innovation (HPI) has world leading nurse researchers in the areas of Acute and Critical care, Ageing and Older People, and Family and Midwifery.

The first National Centre of Research Excellence in Nursing Interventions for Hospitalized Patients (NCREN) sits within HPI. The Centre was awarded \$2.5 million funding from the National Health and Medical Research Council and the researchers are building an unprecedented body of evidence to inform nursing practices on skin integrity and symptom management into the future.
